There is a lot to do before this can happen, and there will be a full consultation during the Autumn. When we come back after the summer holidays, I will put out some FAQs on our website which will provide more information.

The governors and I are pleased that the question of which trust our school will join has been resolved and we can get on together with the improvement of the provision for all our children.

I hope you have a restful summer break, and I look forward to welcoming the children back in their full school uniform (including black school shoes) on Wednesday 6th September at 8.50am.
