English

This half term our focus will be on folktales. Using the folktale 'The Stinky Cheeseman', the children will be identifying key features used in this text type whilst discussing folktale writing in greater depth. We will also be building on our grammatical knowledge and using a variety of punctuation, grammatical structures and high level vocabulary to enhance our own writing of a folktale.

Maths

Our focus will be place value. This unit builds on previous learning in Year 3 about place value within 1,000. We will continue to use these previously learnt skills and apply them when working with 4-digit numbers.

We will also be placing much of our focus on Times Tables. It is extremely important that your child practices their times tables in preparation for the Government's Multiplication Tables Check later in the year. Please ensure they practice. Any additional times tables worksheets can be provided if needed.

Science

Our focus will be Electricity. The children will learn the different ways electricity can be generated and be able to identify electrical appliances and the types of electricity they use. Additionally, we will be learning how to construct a simple series circuit and how to sort materials into whether they are conductors or insulators. Your child will be using their observation, investigatory and classifying skills this term.

Homework

Online learning tasks will be set weekly (every Friday) via *Purple Mash* and *TT Rockstars*. Please ensure your child completes these tasks set as it will support them in their learning and build their confidence. These sites offer a variety of fun games for your children to explore.

Reading Books

Reading books will be sent home daily. Please record when your child reads in their reading record and return to school each day.

History

Our focus this half term is history and we will be looking at the Romans. The children will be using written accounts, pictures and films to learn about the impact of the Roman invasion on the people of Britain. Any extra research carried out at home will enhance and support their learning in lessons.

RE

In RE, we will be discussing and focusing on the question 'What can we learn from religions about what is right and wrong?' This aspect of RE will enable your child to think about guidance that people follow to help them live their lives.

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
