English

This half term our focus will be explanation texts and narrative writing. Our texts – You wouldn't want to be a Victorian Schoolchild and Street Child - will link to our History topic of Victorian working children. The children will explore features of explanation texts before writing their own based on a Victorian theme.

For narrative writing, the children will use our class novel to explore both character and setting descriptions.

Maths

Our focus will be place value up to 10,000,000. Building on the children's knowledge of numbers up to 1 million the unit will focus on ordering, partitioning and comparing larger numbers, using number lines and exploring negative numbers. Later in the half term the children will build on their prior learning of the four number operations.

Please encourage your child to continue to practise their multiplication and division facts on a regular basis.

Science

Our focus will be Evolution and Inheritance. The children will learn about the ways in which life has evolved, about inherited characteristics and how living things of the same species vary. They will explore these concepts through a variety of practical investigations as well as independent research.

Homework

Online learning tasks will be set weekly via *Purple Mash* and *TT Rock Stars*. Your child can also access sites such as *Maths frame* and *My Mini Maths* which will enable them to practise their arithmetic skills.

RE

Our big question for the half term is 'Creation and Science: Conflicting or Complementary?' The children will explore the Christian and scientific ideas about how the Earth was created and discuss if people can be both a scientist and a Christian.

History

Our focus this half term is History. The children will begin by considering the Victorian era as a period of huge change and development before moving on to explore the lives of poor children who were forced to work. They will compare their lives with those of the Victorians and investigate the impact of reforms on the lives of those children.
