#### **English**

This half term our focus will be on narrative writing. The children will use the short film 'Alma' to write their own stories, concentrating on using specific vocabulary to change and enhance the mood of their writing. They will focus on improving their writing by the use of different clauses.

#### Maths

Our focus will be the four operations where the children will reinforce their learning in the use of efficient written methods. We will then move onto fractions which will include adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing using different fractions.

#### RE

We will be asking the question – How do Christians prepare for Christmas? The children will explore the links to scriptures of the Advent candles and what these represent.

#### Science

Our focus will be completing our topic on Evolution and Inheritance and then moving onto our new topic of 'Light', where the children will investigate how light travels and how prisms can be used to split light.

#### Homework

Online learning tasks will be set weekly via Purple Mash Spelling and TT Rockstars. These sites offer a variety of fun games for your children to explore. A little every day makes a huge difference to their learning in all areas of maths!

#### **Reading Books**

All children have access to our beautiful library and the class bookshelves too. If your child has reading books at home, they are more than welcome to bring these into school to read if they prefer.

#### Geography

Our focus this half term is on mountainous environments. The children will investigate the major world mountain ranges; they will learn how mountains are formed and discuss the ways in which climate change is affecting mountainous environments.
