PAEDIATRIC NURSE PRACTITIONERS SERVICE

We offer appointments to children who have acute illness who are unable to get an appointment with their GP. We provide clinical assessment, diagnosis and treatment this includes coughs, colds, sore throats, high temperature, ear ache, rashes, vomiting, diarrhoea, tummy pain, mild skin conditions, general illness and asthma. We refer patients on to other services where appropriate.

We offer clinics in Heywood, Middleton and Rochdale. The service runs Monday to Friday and we offer appointments in Middleton on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 10:00am until 6:00pm.

We are also hoping to have clinics running from February in Middleton Monday through to Friday and extending our times to 07.00pm- we will update you once this has been set up. Patients are able to also attend our clinics in Heywood and Rochdale.

If your child is unwell or if your child is being sent home unwell; we are able to come see a nurse who can help, usually on the same day and get treatment if necessary.
