Vocabulary

Conurbation – large urban area made up of many towns

Population - number of people living in an area

Aerial photograph – a photograph taken from up in the sky

Map scale - is the relationship between the distance on the map and distance in real life

Greenbelt – an invisible line around an area of land to protect the green space and wild life from being built on Industrial areas – businesses or factories where things are made or stored

Housing estates – places where there are a large number of houses for people to live

Ordnance survey map - a detailed map made by the UK Government
